



Assessing for Domestic Violence Homicide Risk to Increase Victim Safety

Research has shown nearly half of female homicide victims are killed by a current or former male intimate partner. For over 30 years, Dr. Jacquelyn C. Campbell's Danger Assessment screening tool has been utilized by domestic violence advocates, law enforcement, courts, medical personnel and others to increase victim safety and prevent homicides. Dr. Campbell is a national leader in Domestic Violence research and advocacy. She has conducted more than twelve major research studies in collaboration with DV advocates and other interdisciplinary scholars and has authored more than 300 publications and seven books. She has been on the Board of Directors of 5 DV advocacy organizations, is currently on the Board of Directors of Futures without Violence and has been involved with multiple policy initiatives.

This free training will provide participants with foundational information about the risk factors associated with domestic violence homicide and a comprehensive overview of the Danger Assessment screening tool. Participants will have the opportunity to ask Dr. Campbell questions before and during the training. Registration is required to attend. This event will be most relevant for members of law enforcement, domestic violence advocates, prosecutors, and court personnel.
